85 guests and members of SMPTE and Audio Engineering Society attended the Detroit Section December meeting held at General Television Network's new \$3.5 million audio facility. The meeting opened with an overview tutorial on recording studio design and construction by Mr. Russ Berger, President of the Russ Berger Design Group, Inc. of Dallas, Texas. He then discussed the specific design of GTN's new audio wing. Following the presentation and a question and answer session, the audience was invited to tour the new facility. Jay Scott, GTN's audio supervisor, conducted the tour and described the equipment. AP-1 was the first stop, featuring an SSL 6000 series console configured for stereo surround mixing. Also resident was a 16-channel Screen Sound hard disk audio system. AP-2 also had a Lexicon OPUS digital workstation. The two audio post rooms and the audio off line room were all tied together via Ethernet for music and effects selection and distribution.
